Doing this COVID-19 there are more people walking, kids riding their bikes, and utilizing the bike trail. I'm saying this because it still seems that the speeders don't care. I'm worried that some innocent kid will get hit by these traffic violators/hit and run criminals.

I understand Pittsburg PD can't sit on Crestview all day, but there has to be a way to control of this. One suggestion I made at the last neighborhood community meeting was to add taller reflector bumps, this would deter them from doing donuts because it will damage there tires. This is something that the city of Martinez is doing and it seems to work. It shouldn't be that expense to install.

Several residents are expressing concern on Next Door regarding the many sideshows occurring at all hours of the day and night. I live in a neighborhood with a one way in and out entry. They are coming all the way into our court off of Buchanan and Loveridge early AM and midday. Doing donuts with parked cars and kids playing nearby. My neighbors are afraid to say anything in fear of retaliation. At one point all of the neighbors came out of their home because of the noise, smell of burning rubber and smoke. We were waiting for something terrible to happen. They sped off thinking someone may have called the police. As they sped past, I asked them to slow down and they stopped and threatened me with many choice words.

I can speak for other friends that are in fear of the car crashing through their home as they are doing this daily in her neighborhood, near Hillview JHS. The old Food Source lot is another favorite spot, albeit, safer than our neighborhoods. We are filming this only to be told there's nothing that can be done unless they are caught by PPD. We need help to get this under control, before someone gets seriously hurt or property is severely damaged. If they are minors, perhaps their family can pay the fines and maybe it will stop. If they are adults, hold them accountable. Adults or minors, they need to be held accountable or this will not stop.

Nothing was done, the car stayed parked on the side of the street for over week.

Crestview Drive has turned into a main street like Railroad Ave. These care do not stop or slowdown at stop signs, it's a raceway.

I challenge the City Council Members to take a ride up and back down Crestview Drive. I want you to experience how we live day after day in fear, praying we don't get hit again or another person is killed.

Solutions:

- * Automatically impound cars for 2 months
- * Middle divider on Crestview Drive (prevent speeders from going around other drivers doing the speed limit)
- * Speed bumps
- * Roundabouts at cross streets
- * Cameras at cross streets (take pictures/record video as proof to impound cars)
- * Daily patrol from police (not just when we call)
- * Close Crestview back down at the canal except for emergency vehicles (it was closed many years ago, this would stop the traffic of people who don't live her but they use Crestview as a short cut)

We have attended the neighborhood meetings, voiced our concerns, now it time for ACTIONS! People that live here are tired. We're begging for help NOT excuses.

Dear Council Members:

The people of Pittsburg are speaking out about a continuous, ongoing daily problem. Every afternoon, evening, and late at night, citizens throughout the city experience a plague.

Not the COVID-19 type. . . It's a plague of the bored-out-of-their-minds young adults who are doing donuts in every possible cul-de-sac available. They burn rubber, leave marks, periodically have accidents, and create a truly nauseating noise for hours which you can hear blocks away. If you live in Pittsburg, you've heard it. It's going on as we write this. The smell and noise alone are bad enough, but it's also dangerous: to residents, the environment, and the reputation of the city.

Only a handful of cars are involved -- some of whom have been identified by others already as a black Mustang and a silver sports car -- but I would add to that list a couple motorcycles who use the School and Harbor neighborhood as a drag strip -- often late at night. One (a Yamaha?) has been modified to emit an excruciatingly high-pitched whine; the other has the eardrum-busting loud rumble of a Harley. We don't know what can be done but are sure that, once they become aware of the problem, the police could put a stop to it. We are asking that you take steps to please, once and for all, to address this issue so we can all finally experience some peace.
