Jordan Davis, Director of Community and Economic Development, called the meeting to order at approximately 4.34pm.

3. Minutes of the March 18, 2026 Meeting – Madam Chair Kobata called for a motion to accept the minutes. Madam Co-Chair had no comments and motioned to accept, which was seconded by Madam Chair Kobata.
4. Community Services - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Update.

Chair Kobata introduced the item and Jordan Davis passed it on to Ishani Rasanayagam, Administrative Analyst II, who provided a presentation on the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. She informed the Subcommittee that the funding allocations for FY 2026-2027 had been released by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Ishani explained that the Subcommittee was responsible for recommending funding allocation amounts for each subrecipient to the City Council and reviewed the allocation process.

The Subcommittee discussed various allocation options and reached a final recommendation regarding the proposed funding amounts. A motion was made by Chair Kobata to recommend to the City Council to approve the CDBG Annual Action Plan for FY 2026-2027 Funding Allocations, Option #2. The motion was seconded by Vice Chair Adams and approved unanimously.
